



THE ICEMAN “OETZI”

Since the „Oetzi“ was discovered in 1991, Archaeo-Technik is studying the equipment the iceman carried with him on his last „mountain hike“. These finds are in remarkably good condition and all of them are items of Neolithic everyday life. Research into the techniques of making these things led to numerous archaeological experiments during the last years. The results of these works allowed a more extensive and precise view of several aspects of the iceman’s life and death.



Meanwhile there are at least two travelling exhibitions on the subject area „Oetzi“ touring through Europe. The iceman himself and the accompanying finds are exhibited in the Archaeological Museum of Bozen (Italy), and in the Schnals Valley in South Tyrol an ArcheoParc was created with an open-air area showing the circumstances of life 5 300 years ago (see also “[major building site](#)”). Many of the modern replicas shown in these museums come from our studio. Archaeo-Technik also accompanies these travelling exhibitions with demonstrations of Stone Age techniques or with additional reconstructions or photos of their manufacturing.
